October 13th - STC Sporting Clays, 1419 SW 120th Augusta, KS Trap, Skeet, and Sporting Clays will all shoot 100 targets.

- Registration fees will be \$60 per shotgun event (Trap, Skeet, and Sporting Clays).
- The live scoring link for the match weekend will be provided at the events via QR code. Those without publicity release will be posted as first initial of first name only.
- The use of reloads is prohibited in 4-H. Anyone shooting reloads or ammunition outside the 4-H <u>Fall Match</u> <u>Rules</u> will be disqualified.
- Coaches will confirm squads at check-in. Squads may be moved to the first available range at the match steering group's discretion.
- Teams will be determined by score. Only County or District Teams are allowed. If a youth from a separate county shoots with a different program, their score will count toward the County where they are enrolled, unless the program is considered a District program.
- TEAM DESIGNATIONS All match teams will be automatically selected based on top aggregate scores shot at the state match event. 1. For County Extension units, there may only be one team from each county unit. 2. For Extension Districts, there may be as many teams as there are counties in the district if the participants are registered as a district. The five member team may consist of Junior and Senior Members.

Trap and Skeet

- Day Check-In:
 - Check-in will open at 7:00 AM, check-in 2 hours prior to flight time thereafter. Competitors must be present on the range, but one person (coach) is responsible for check-in inside the club house.
 - 7:30 AM Opening ceremony
 - 7:45 AM Safety Meeting and Flag Ceremony
 - 8:00 AM First squads start
 - Scorecards will be given to coaches at time of check-in.
- On the Range:
 - Youth will shoot a session of 50 targets then break while the next squad shoots a session of 50 targets and be immediately back on the line to shoot their second session of 50 targets. Initialing of the scorecards and field cleanup is to happen at the end of each 50-target session.
 - Squad times are estimates and youth need to be there prior to scheduled times. If you
 are not there when the prior squad is finished you will not get to make up those lost
 shots. Promptness is important for the tournament to stay in motion.
 - Skeet: Each team must provide an adult puller for their squads. The puller will have no input on scoring and is not allowed to coach.
 - Each team will give scorekeepers the scorecard.
 - Competitors are to verify final score by initialing scorecard.
 - Spectators are asked to stay south of the walkway and not block the walkway.

Sporting Clays

- o Check-In:
 - Check-in 30 minutes prior to squad time. To help with parking lot congestion do not arrive earlier than 30 minutes prior to start time. Competitors must be present, but one person (coach) is responsible for check-in.
 - Check-in at the clubhouse.
 - Scorecards will be given to coaches at time of check in.
 - Please limit "buggy" use to those who cannot physically handle walking the course.
 - 4-H sporting clay competitors may not shoot on public course prior to designated squad times the day of the event.
- On the Range:
 - Each squad will have a designated scorekeeper.
 - Each team must provide an adult puller for their squads. The puller will have no input on scoring and not allowed to coach.
 - Course time allowed is two hours. Please move promptly through the course.
- There will be designated Range Safety Officers for each of Trap, Skeet, and Sporting Clay programs.
- The Jury for the Match will be:
 - o Cody Woelk, *Chair,* Melvin Crow, Eric Klein, and Derek Zongker
- Concessions to be determined. Please come prepared for no concessions available.
- Spectators on the course must wear eye and hearing protection.
- Port-a-potties will be available on Saturday for Trap & Skeet as the facilities in the club house will not handle the increased traffic.
- No animals other than registered service animals.
- The deadline for submitting applications for National Match for Archery, Muzzleloading, Shotgun, Hunting Skills, Small Bore Pistol, and Small Bore Rifle disciplines is October 19.
